" BEATING THE BOUNDS " SUNDAY 29th APRIL 1990.

Start at Forest Farm Car Park at 2.00.p.m. The route will follow the Taff south to the new housing area. Here we will omit the lower section of the river path to the water wheel. (This will be a visit for another day) Our path will take us to the southern end of Longwood and then to the Cardiff Railway Cutting via the public footpath. In the cutting we will see the changes effected by several years of coppicing. From the cutting we will cross Long Wood Drive into the middle section and see the piers of the Cardiff Railway bridge across the canal. On passing beneath the M4, we will explore the top section of the reserve and then return to Foresr Farm via the Three Castles Cycleway.

An active Watch group of 30 plus members meet at the Warden Centre usually on the third Saturday of each month. Watch nationally is aimed ar 8 to 18 year olds but the Forest Farm group caters for a much wider age band. The children are actively involved in projects on the reserve. This year they have gathered information on the flora and fauna of the canal and ponds for Pondwatch - a national survey of freshwater habitats organised by the Wild fowl and Wetlands Trust. Some 20 nestboxes were constructed by the youngsters which they then sited around the reserve.
